They story ends with Charlie choosing the rich woman.

If I were the writer, I would add more to the opening. I would tell readers more about Charlie's love of music, and I would write more about his good qualities so as to show why the two women like Charlie at the same time. In the build-up of the story, I would write more about how the two women pursued him in different ways. Moreover, I would write about an argument between the two women. I would add more information about the characters so that readers understand their family background. I would also change the ending of the story. At first, Charlie wants to choose the poor woman, and then I would write about what the rich woman is doing to make Charlie change his mind. This will make the story more realistic.

I don't have any similar experience, but I always see something like that on TV. The story describes a common life experience in which we have to choose between interest and money. If I were Charlie, I would choose the poor woman because they have the same hobby, and they can enjoy being together. Although they are poor, they can make money together. It will be a good memory in their life.

To conclude, Charlie's choice is an outstanding story. I think that for most writers, they would let Charlie choose the poor woman because they are like-minded. However, in real life, other reasons such as money could change our relationship with others. So, this story is a realistic one.
