The film *Interstellar* is directed by Christopher Nolan and stars Matthew McConaughey and Anne Hathaway. With an IIA rating and a total runtime of 169 minutes, this film provides an intense, high-stakes cinematic experience.

Set against a backdrop of a dying planet, the narrative centers on a group of explorers who venture through a wormhole near Saturn. Ultimately, the perfect combination of captivating visuals, profound themes and powerful story telling makes this film a classic movie. Deciding if it is worth your time is easy. If you appreciate well-acted science-fiction that challenges your mind and pulls at your heartstrings, *Interstellar* is a must-watch.
