About your trip in coming December, I have some suggestions for you. First, if you want to bargain in shopping, it's a good idea to go to the Stanley Market and the Ladies Market. The Stanley Market has a wide variety of stalls selling Hong Kong souvenirs and clothes---particularly traditional Chinese dresses and silk garments, toys, luggage, ornaments, Chinese arts and crafts. In the Ladies' Market, there are stalls selling distinctive merchandises at a low price. Then if you want to see nature, such as beaches, animals and trees, I recommend you visit Hong Kong Wetland Park and Mai Po Marshes Nature Reserve. In recent years, Mai Po Marshes have been the shelter of over 55,00 migrating birds, including Saunder's gull and a quarter of the world's black-faced spoonbill population. Also, in Hong Kong Wetland Park, there are different kinds of facilities for watching birds. I hope you will have an unforgettable experience in these places.

Next, Hong Kong has different sorts of local delicacies. I suggest you try two special dishes which are on the must-try list in Hong Kong. First, Siu Mai is a small steamed dumpling with pork and prawns, which is wrapped in a piece of thin white wheat wrapper. It usually has crab roe and mushrooms on the top. Second, barbecued meat is a type of Siu Mei which is in fact Cantonese roasted pork. Sometimes, this meat is served with a bun, rice or noodles.

Finally, Hong Kong has some other good places to visit. If you want to see Chinese heritage, it's great to visit the Kowloon Walled City Park. It features some scenic landscape and a fully restored Yamen as its centerpiece. You can take some pictures there. Tai O Fishing Village is a village that has some stilt houses and graded buildings. After the sightseeing trip, you can go to eat at some seafood vendors and buy some traditional food, like salted fish and shrimp paste.
