Book Review – Matilda

Matilda is a fun story which is suitable for children as a bedtime story. Matilda Wormwood is highly talented and hardworking. She has a lazy brother, a bossy mother and a ratty father. I don't think Matilda having superpower is a good idea, but I like the plot that Miss Honey is actually the niece of Ms Trunchbull. Such a relationship is a good twist.
