Stone Nullah Lane, named after the water channel previously located on it, was once ceded to the British under the Treaty of Nanjing in 1842. The street is noted for its many historical landmarks such as Pak Tai Temple, the headquarters of St. James' Settlement and the Blue House.

The class visited the Yellow House - a very special and old tenement house (Tong Lau) in Wan Chai. Built in 1928, the construction is well-known for its yellow outer wall. It has now been listed as Grade III Historic Building.
